

• 6-A Facilities and Equipment

- Section 8.01
 - Aligns the section with the SFA monitoring tool
 - Allows a district to be placed in Accredited-Cited or Accredited-Probation status at any time if any violation of the Standards has not been corrected or a plan or correcting the violation has not been submitted, rather than waiting until May for the classification.
 - Changes the time for submitting a plan to correct the deficiency from thirty days to fifteen days
- Section 10.01
 - Brings the appeal process in line with the proposed new Section 8.01

- Section 11.01
 - Allows the Commissioner to waive the timeline for obtaining waivers of the Standards for Accreditation in the event of emergency circumstances
 - Previously could not obtain a waiver after April 20
- 1-A.1.3
 - Requires the Division to post the list of courses that must be offered annually to the Division's website after approved by the State Board of Education.
- 1-A.2
 - Clarifies that the 120 clock-hour rule applies to high school units of credit, not K-12 units of credit

- 1-A.5 (now 1-A.4)
 - Requires districts to post the school calendar on the district website by August 1 each year.
- 1-A.4.3
 - Incorporates provisions of Act 641 of 2019 (recess)
- 1-B.3.1
 - This requirement already existed in the DESE Rules Governing Nutrition and Physical Activity, but has been added as a separate standard for monitoring purposes

- 1-C.2.4 through 1-C.2.6
 - 1-C.2.4 was previously in the Standards at 1-A.1.3.11, but has been moved to a new Section for convenience
 - 1-C.2.5 and 1-C.2.6 were added so that all graduation requirements would be in the Standards
- 2-B.3
 - Incorporated provisions of Act 676 of 2019 (vaccinations and immunizations)
- 2-C.1
 - Incorporated provisions of Act 190 of 2019 (School Counseling Improvement Act of 2019)

- 3-B.2
 - Removed the October 15 deadline to give District's more flexibility to hold the annual public meeting to explain policies, programs, and goals to the community.
- 4-C.3
 - Added to require that any first year administrator be registered with the Division to ensure that these administrators receive mentoring supporting for their first three years.
- 4-C.4
 - Added to require that each building and district level administrator receive a summative rating at east once every four years

- 4-D.4
 - Added to require that any first year teacher be registered with the Division to ensure that these teachers receive mentoring supporting for their first three years.
- 4-D.5
 - Added to require that each teacher receive a summative rating at east once every four years
- 4-E.3
 - Added to incorporate the School Counseling Improvement Act of 2019
