


#### One Definition

## Significance

- \$10.9 million year after year
- To state accounts for about .25% of total education budget
- To school districts accounts for a minimum .3% to a maximum 26.1% of school districts' overall funding



## Types of Isolated Funding

- Isolated (ACA 6-20-603)
- Special Needs Isolated (ACA 6-20-604)
  - 4 sets of criteria
- Special Needs Isolated Transportation (ACA 6-20-604)

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#### Isolated

- 1980s ACA 6-20-601
- Isolated school district had to meet 4 of 5 conditions:
  - Long distances
  - Low student density (3 / sq. mile and 1.2 /sq. mile)
  - Large in area (100+ square miles)
  - Low proportion of hard-surfaced roads
  - Geographic obstacles

#### Isolated

If determined to meet 4 of 5, eligible for funding based on enrollment IF

- Met budget and millage requirement AND
- Had enrollment less than 350

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#### Isolated

- Act 60 of 2003 no districts below 350 for more than two years
- Act 65 froze isolated status and funding amounts
- What happens when isolated area closes?
   ACA 6-20-603(i) tells us
- Newest wrinkle waivers now granted for schools below 350 enrollment







# Special Needs Isolated

- Created by Act 1452 in 2005
- To qualify:
  - Part of consolidation/annexation
  - "Impractical or unwise" to close
  - Meet original requirements
- Four categories of funding (page 6 of report)
- Funded with \$3 million appropriation

### Special Needs Isolated

**25** 

districts received special needs isolated funding in 2016-17

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## Special Needs Isolated - Transportation

- Created by Act 1052 of 2007
- Any money left over
- Divided evenly to all districts qualifying for 10%, 15% or 20% of special needs isolated (13 in 2016-2017)
  - Not to small districts

# Special Needs Isolated - Transportation


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districts each received \$276,039 special needs isolated funding in 2016-17

### **Expenditures**

Transportation -- \$4.3 million

Instruction-related expenses -- \$4.1 million

Operations and Maintenance -- \$.9 million

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# Characteristics of Isolated Districts

(page 13-14)

- Larger in square miles
- Low density
- Higher transportation costs
- Higher per-pupil expenditures
- Lower starting/average teacher salary

# Characteristics of Students in Isolated Districts

(page 14)

- Higher % free and reduced price lunch
- Lower test scores
