1 INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2011-200 2 3 REQUESTING THAT THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ASSIGN TO THE 4 INTERIM SENATE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION A STUDY OF THE INTERSTATE 5 COMPACT ON EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY FOR MILITARY CHILDREN. 6 WHEREAS, the mobile military lifestyle creates tough challenges for 7 8 military children who attend, on average, six to nine (6-9) different school systems from kindergarten to grade twelve (K-12); and 9 10 WHEREAS, through no fault of their own, military families often face 11 difficulties with enrollment, eligibility, placement, and timely graduation 12 13 of their children; and 14 WHEREAS, the Council of State Governments' National Center for 15 16 Interstate Compacts and the Department of Defense, in collaboration with federal, state, and local officials and national stakeholder organizations 17 18 representing numerous education groups, developed an interstate compact to 19 address the challenges that military children face due to frequent 20 relocations, which has come to be known as the Interstate Compact on 21 Educational Opportunity for Military Children; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military 24 Children, when enacted in all fifty (50) states, will allow military children 25 enrolled in kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) who transfer between 26 school districts to be treated uniformly; and 27 28 WHEREAS, to participate, each state must adopt the Compact through 29 legislation, appoint representation to an ongoing governing commission, and 30 provide nominal funding of one dollar (\$1.00) per active duty military child 31 in the state; and 32 33 WHEREAS, currently, forty (40) of the fifty (50) states have adopted the Compact, and every state surrounding Arkansas has adopted the Compact; 34 35 and 36

1 WHEREAS, each member state that participates in the Compact is provided common guidelines and support for handling issues that impact military 2 3 children as they transition between schools; and 4 5 WHEREAS, a number of states have conducted independent research that concluded the Compact is an effective, multistate agreement to address the 6 7 unique needs of transitioning military children; and 8 9 WHEREAS, in the 2009 Regular Session, the General Assembly enacted a law regarding educational access for military children, Arkansas Code § 6-27-10 11 101 et seq.; however, this act only put into law the policy portion of the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children and is 12 insufficient to make Arkansas a member of the Compact, 13 14 15 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH 16 GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 17 18 19 THAT the Legislative Council assign to the Interim Senate Committee on Education a study of the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for 20 21 Military Children. 22 23 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the committee reviews, hears testimony on, 24 and works with all educational stakeholders to develop a noncontroversial bill draft for introduction in the 2013 Regular Session that incorporates the 25 Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children and the 26 necessary enabling law so that Arkansas can become a member of the Compact 27 28 and provide uniform treatment of military children. 29 30 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the committee works with the Joint Budget Committee, fiscal staff, and the Department of Education to ensure that the 31 32 necessary funding and appropriation is available for Arkansas to join the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children, an 33 34 amount that is estimated to be less than four thousand five hundred dollars (\$4,500). 35
