JAG teams educators and employers to provide selected secondary career and technical education students with academic and workplace skills. These efforts will lead them to a successful career and/or further education and training upon completion of high school.

Jobs for Arkansas's Graduates is affiliated with the national organization, Jobs for America's Graduates. To keep this affiliation, states must adopt model program components and performance standards.

JAG performance standards

Graduation rate: Ninety percent of all JAG participants must graduate within one year of their high school graduation date.

<u>Positive outcome:</u> Upon graduation, eight percent of all program participants must be engaged in work, postsecondary education or training, military service, or a combination of the above.
