RE :	Teacher Salaries

Responses to the following questions have been prepared in partial fulfillment of the requirements of Act 57 of the Second Extraordinary Session of 2003.

- 1. How do Arkansas teacher salaries compare with surrounding states and states of the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB)?
- 2. How have the average teacher salaries changed in Arkansas compared to surrounding states and states in the SREB from 2009-10 to 2010-11?
- 3. How does the cost of living in Arkansas and surrounding states affect the value of Arkansas teacher salaries?
- 4. Has the disparity in teacher salaries within Arkansas increased or decreased in FY 2010-11?
- 5. How do teacher salaries in Arkansas compare with the salaries in other professions with similar educational requirements within the state?
- 6. What instructional areas have the largest number of teachers teaching out of area in Arkansas?

1. How do Arkansas teacher salaries compare with surrounding states and states of the Southern Regional Education Board?

Information provided to the committee was based on a report from the National Education Association (NEA) in December 2011. Staff of the Policy Analysis and Research Section of the Bureau of Legislative Research updated the information for the 2010-11 school year by using the information obtained from the NEA webpage, as well as websites of state departments of education and by contacting staff of the departments of education of these states. The following table is a result of that update with the best information available at this time.

2. How have the average teacher salaries changed in Arkansas compared with surrounding states and states in the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) from 2009-10 to 2010-11?

Since the 2009-10 school year, average teacher salaries in Arkansas have grown 1.96%. Of the surrounding states Oklahoma, Mississippi, and Missouri have exceeded Arkansas's growth. Of the SREB states, five have exceeded the growth of Arkansas. All of the states represented below have shown growth in teacher salaries except Florida, North Carolina, and Texas.

3. How does the cost of living in Arkansas, its surrounding states, and the SREB states affect the value of Arkansas teacher salaries?

When the cost of living is considered and Arkansas is made the constant, Arkansas ranks 11th for the cost of living adjustment. Without adjustment, Arkansas would rank 13th among these same states.

4. Has the disparity in teacher salaries within Arkansas increased or decreased in FY 2010-11?

Minimum Salary

The beginning salaries have not changed, according to the data provided by the Arkansas Department of Education. The district with the lowest beginning salary in 2009-2010 was \$29,244, while the lowest minimum salary paid in 2010-2011 was still \$29,244. There are thirteen districts that paid \$29,244 as their minimum hiring salary.

The minimum teacher salary has not been increased since the 2007 legislative session. The current minimum salary of \$29,244 did not go into effect until FY 2009.

Average Salary

The state average salary has increased over the last five years. According to the Annual Statistical Report (ASR) provided by the Arkansas Department of Education, the state's average salary in 2009-10 was \$46,601, while the average salary calculated by the Bureau of Legislative Research and the Department of Education for the state in 2010-11 was \$46,823, an increase of 0.48%.



On the other hand, the disparity in average salary has fluctuated over the years. The lowest district average salary in 2010-11 was \$33,821, which is \$4,577 above the state minimum requirements.

Additional Information

This report utilizes two data sources for comparing average teacher salaries: the National Education Association (NEA) and the Arkansas Department of Education (ADE).

The first section of the report compares the average salary of the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) states as well as the states that surround Arkansas utilizing the NEA data. These comparisons are found on pages 2-4 of the report. The NEA calculation is described below.

1. National Education Association Average Teacher Salary Calculation:

The average annual salary is the total amount regularly paid or stipulated to be paid to an individual before deductions for Social Security, health insurance, and the like. The average annual teacher salary is computed as the weighted arithmetic mean of salary figures reported for full-time equivalent elementary and secondary classroom and substitute teachers assigned to instruct pupils. <u>Included are regular salaries for full-time and part-time teachers and substitute teachers</u>.

Does not include

- "extra pay for extra duty"
- payments for teaching summer school (with the exception of 12-month employees)
- salaries for other categories of employees
- salaries for vacant positions
- curriculum specialists
- guidance counselors
- librarians
- media specialists
- remedial specialists
- others possessing educational certification but who are not responsible for day-to-day teaching of the same group of pupils.
- instructional aides
- attendance personnel
- health services personnel
- psychologists
- social workers
- clerical personnel
- community college staff
- or persons whose jobs do not require skills in the field of education
- principals
- assistant principals
- supervisors
- superintendents
- assistant superintendents

In the second portion of the report, ADE's Annual Statistical Report (ASR) methodology is utilized for comparison on page 7 for the years 2003-2010.

The overall average salary of the state, as well as the highest and lowest district average salaries are also compared and reported on page 7 of the report for the years 2003-2010.

A different calculation was utilized for the year 2010-2011, because it was noted by the Bureau that a number of districts had significant salary changes from the ASR in 2009-2010 and 2010-2011. Therefore, the Bureau of Legislative Research, with the cooperative efforts of the Department of Education, calculated a new average for the districts, instead of using the data from the ASR for the year 2010-2011.

The calculation for a new average was performed by taking the total salaries paid from the FY11 expenditure ledger and dividing it by the number of FTEs reported by the district. There were 28 districts that had reported an incorrect number of FTE; those were adjusted based on correspondence between the BLR and those districts.

The average teacher salary for each district was printed on a map in this report titled "2010-11 Average Salary Rank by School District."

The formula used in the ASR to calculate the average teacher salaries is described below.

2. <u>Arkansas Department of Education Average Teacher Salary Calculation:</u>

The average teacher salary for each district is based on lines 83 and 84 from the ASR. The average salary for each district is the number of full time equivalents (FTE) (line 83) divided by the corresponding salary. Object ranges listed below make up the salary for the ASR (line 84).

<u>Line 83</u>: Personnel – Non-Federal Certified Classroom FTEs. The number of K-12 certified personnel employed by the district as K-12 <u>classroom teachers</u>, <u>librarians</u>, <u>counselors</u>, <u>psychologists</u>, and other <u>K-12 certified</u>, <u>non-administrative employees</u> and paid from the Teacher Salary Fund. *Certified employees paid from federal funds are not included*.

<u>Line 84</u>: Average Salary – Non-Federal Certified Classroom FTEs. The average salary of personnel defined in line 83.

The following ranges of salary objects are included in ASR average salary calculations:

- 61100 Regular Employees
- 61110 Certified. Salary expenditures paid to certified employees from the teacher salary fund, unless funded by a federally sponsored program.
