THE WHO, WHAT, WHY AND HOW QUESTIONS OF DEVELOPMENTAL DYSLEXIA?

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Dyslexia is rare. Dyslexia is a medical diagnosis. There is a test for dyslexia. Dyslexia can't be diagnosed until 3rd grade. Children outgrow dyslexia. People with dyslexia see things backwards. Dyslexia is a visual problem and can be corrected with colored overlays or vision therapies.

What is dyslexia?

DEFINITION OF DYSLEXIA

Dyslexia is a specific learning disability that is neurological in origin. It is characterized by difficulties with accurate and/or fluent word recognition and by poor spelling and decoding abilities. These difficulties typically result from a <u>deficit in the phonological component of language</u> that is often unexpected in relation to other cognitive abilities and the provision of effective classroom instruction. Secondary consequences may include problems in reading comprehension and reduced reading experience that can impede the growth of vocabulary and background knowledge.

- The child is pushed on to the next grade
- The child is retained for a second year of the same instruction
- Intervention that is provided is not helping
- Schools do not test for Dyslexia
- Children in Special Education *never* leave Special Education (80% of students identified as SLD are dyslexic)

The early identification of children atrisk for reading failure coupled with appropriate reading interventions can reduce the percentage of children reading below the basic level in 4th grade to 6% or less.

It takes 4 times as long to remediate a student with poor reading skills in fourth grade as in late kindergarten or early first grade.
