Continued Discussion of Interim Study Proposal (ISP) 2011-030 by Representative Mauch, TO AMEND THE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MINIMUM AGE FOR ENROLLMENT IN PUBLIC SCHOOL KINDERGRTEN

The Honorable Loy Mauch, State Representative, District 26, was recognized. Representative Mauch stated his issue with the requirement that a child must be five years old as of August 1 in order to start kindergarten, and said it was his aim to add flexibility to the start date.
