




CUMULATIVE IMPACT OF SSP


- Since 2009-2010 SSP participation is as follows:
 - · 42 Schools
 - 13 Superintendents (Superintendent institute)
 - 50 Principals (MPP)
 - 594 leadership team participants (DKTL institute participants)
 - 202 teachers (Teacher institute)
 - 165 participants in Facilitator Training
 - 95 students participated in the Student Voice conference
 - Over 50,000 students served in SSP schools since 2009-2010
