3	REQUESTING THE INTERIM HOUSE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION TO CONDUCT A
4	STUDY OF THE BEST PRACTICES FROM PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOLS IN THE
5	STATE AND IN THE NATION THAT MAY BE IMPLEMENTED IN ARKANSAS
6	SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO IMPROVE THE EFFICIENCY OF THE STATE'S SYSTEM
7	OF PUBLIC EDUCATION AND STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT LEVELS.
8	
9	WHEREAS, the General Assembly enacted the Arkansas Charter Schools Act
10	of 1999 to provide educational environments that:
11	(1) Improve student learning;
12	(2) Increase learning opportunities for all students, with
13	special emphasis on expanded learning experiences for students who are
14	identified as low-achieving;
15	(3) Encourage the use of different and innovative teaching
16	methods;
17	(4) Create new professional opportunities for teachers,
18	including the opportunity to be responsible for the learning program at the
19	school site; and
20	(5) Provide parents and pupils with expanded choices in the
21	types of educational opportunities that are available within the public
22	school system; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, in the twenty (20) years since the charter school movement
25	began nationally, researchers have analyzed the successes and failures of
26	charter schools; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, that national and state research should be applied to a study
29	of possible improvements to the non-charter public school system in Arkansas
30	
31	NOW THEREFORE,
32	BE IT PROPOSED BY THE INTERIM HOUSE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION OF THE EIGHTY-
33	NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
34	
35	THAT the Interim House Committee On Education conduct a study of the
36	best practices from public charter schools in the state and in the nation

that may be implemented in Arkansas school districts to improve the 1 2 efficiency of the state's system of public education and student achievement 3 levels. 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the study shall review and provide б recommendations for the application of the successful strategies of charter schools to non-charter public schools for: 7 8 (1) Improving student learning for all students; 9 Increasing learning opportunities for all students through 10 expanded learning experiences for students who are identified as low-11 achieving; 12 (3) Using different and innovative teaching methods; (4) Creating new professional opportunities for teachers, 13 14 including the opportunity to be responsible for the learning program at the 15 school site; (5) Providing parents and pupils with expanded choices in the 16 types of educational opportunities; and 17 18 (6)(A) Increasing parental engagement in and responsibility for 19 the education of their children in public schools. 20 (B) The study of parental engagement strategies at charter 21 schools shall compare those strategies with the implementation of the state's 22 current laws governing parental involvement in non-charter public schools. 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the study shall be conducted with the assistance of the Department of Education and public charter schools. 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT by July 1, 2014, the study shall be 27 completed and a report presented to the House Committee on Education and the 28 Senate Committee on Education with findings and recommendations from the 29 study. 30 31 32 Respectfully submitted, 33 34 Representative Charles L.
