Remarks by the Chairs

Representative Bruce Cozart and Senator Jane English, the Chair of the Senate Interim Committee on Education, welcomed legislators and other interested parties to the meeting, the focus of which would be the impact of the Teach For America (TFA) Program.

Welcome and Overview of Pine Bluff School District and the role played by Teach For America (TFA) Arkansas

The Honorable Stephanie Flowers, State Senator, District 25, was recognized. Senator Flowers welcomed legislators to Pine Bluff, the heart of Senate District 25. She stated that TFA is much needed in Pine Bluff, and has become a part of the community. She noted the First Ward Alternative Learning Center is housed in one of the oldest educational facilities in Pine Bluff. Senator Flowers commented on the need for certified teachers, and positive, innovative approaches to education for children.

- understanding the role of TFA in the context of other forces at work in education,
- understanding educational needs, especially in poverty districts,
- utilizing a different perspective in order to be effective,
- impact of having a strong education system,
- what TFA is doing to make a difference in student learning and achievement,

- teachers extending their commitment to TFA,
- First Ward Alternative Learning Center to be recognized by the Arkansas Department of Education as one of the model alternative learning environments in the state, and
- acute need for certified teachers in Arkansas.

Classroom Visits and Rotations (Three (3) Groups on a 35-Minute Rotation)

The legislators and other guests divided into three (3) groups and rotated through classrooms, hearing presentations and participating in discussions.

Classroom 1: <u>Student Panel and Q&A with TFA Alum, **Adrian Dhanaraj**</u> – Met current students and learned about the Pine Bluff School District and the First Ward Alternative Learning Center

Classroom 2: <u>Teach For America Overview and Information</u> – Heard a brief summary of TFA's basic operations and growth plans, and learned about unique aspects of TFA's work in Arkansas

Classroom 3: <u>Serving beyond the two-year commitment</u> – Learned about the impact TFA professionals have on Arkansas education after their initial commitment

Mr. Henderson initiated the panel discussion by posing the question of what is one thing legislators should know about Pine Bluff that would help them strengthen both education and the community, given their role or perspective in this community.

Issues Included in the Discussion:

- o need for financial backing and making resources available for children,
- o agencies and the community working together,
- o legislators taking time to actually visit schools,
- o providing exposure to a better life in order to uplift students and make them want to do better,
- o doing a needs assessment of what students need in today's society.
- o taking a systemic approach to looking at how to serve schools with the greatest need,
- o implementing Aggression Replacement Training (ART) life skills strategies,
- year-round schooling,
- o importance of pre-K,
- o recognizing the role of social agency that schools play in providing services to students; children today are not those of 1969; education needs to change,
- o providing skills and alternative career paths to that of college,
- o breakdown of families; impact of grandparents raising their grandchildren,

- o impact of technology and the digital age on students,
- o becoming aware of what students have to deal with,
- o the thin line between handicapping and helping students, and
- o applying skills learned in the classroom to working in the community.
