11	(-1) Allow or restrict-the-possession and use of a personal

13	(-2)-Allow the-use-of-a-personal-electronic device in school for
14	instructional-purposes at-the-discretion-of-a-teacher-or-administrator;
15	(3) Limit the times or locations in which a personal electronic
