Representative Bruce Cozart, the Chair of the House Interim Committee on Education, called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

**The Honorable Charlotte Vining Douglas**, State Representative, District 75, was recognized. Representative Douglas announced she had several copies available of the DVD, "School of the Future," a program which was televised on the Arkansas Educational Television Network (AETN) as part of the NOVA series. She encouraged members to view the program.

Discussion of Draft Adequacy Report and Related Issues

Representative Cozart presented a draft document of proposed changes to the Matrix for FY18. He said the numbers for FY19 were not adjusted and were a repetition of those for FY18. Representative Cozart stated that he expected to take up adjustments for FY19 at a later time. He reviewed proposed funding increases for:

School-Level Salaries: Teacher Salary + Benefits; School-level secretary
School-Level Resources: Extra Duty Funds; Substitutes
Carry-Forward: Operations & Maintenance; Transportation
Categorical Program Funding: English Language Learners (ELL); Alternative Learning Environment (ALE).

He said with regard to additional National School Lunch (NSL) funding, discussions have taken place to allocate \$4.3 million to fund a grant program to encourage districts to adopt evidence-based programs in tutoring, afterschool programs, and pre-K that close the achievement gap. Representative Cozart stated the final number for Foundation Per Pupil Expenditures is \$6,692.80, which represents a \$47 per student increase.

Following the review, an extensive discussion ensued.

## Issues Included in the Discussion:

- time it will take to meet the requirements and expectations of *Lake View*,
- state efforts to supplement salaries of teachers in depressed areas,
- examples of evidence-based programs that close the achievement gap,
- addressing the needs of districts that do not have funds or expertise to implement and administer grant programs,
- programs that have been successful in closing the achievement gap,
- creation of a tiered system for the operation of the proposed \$4.3 million NSL Grant Program,
- funding for gifted and talented education,
- school districts getting dedicated matching grants for expenditures,
- ability of a school district to ascertain the success of programs, of lack thereof, by utilizing interim assessment packages,
- allocation of resources in the Matrix for Teacher Salary vs. those for Operations & Maintenance, and
- establishment of a pilot project for community resources coordinators in high poverty school districts to address the achievement gap.

Representative Cozart commented that Transportation has been a big issue. He said, while proposals have been discussed to increase funding for Transportation, he anticipated that Transportation-related issues would likely have to be dealt with separately in the 2017 Regular Session. He anticipated the creation of a Transportation Subcommittee to review issues and various options related to student transportation after the filing of the 2016 Adequacy Report. He remarked one option is to take Transportation out of the Matrix, and requested a show of hands from members who would be supportive of this move.

Representative Cozart stated that it is up to all members of the Committees to make decisions regarding changes to the Matrix. He said the Committees would have the opportunity to review the entire Matrix at the meeting on Monday, October 31, and that the Adequacy Report would be finished on that day. He requested that all members be present at the meeting.
