





Usage Average per Lives Covered



Total Monthly Employee Cost for 2008



Employee Coverage Based on Married With 0 Dependents Figuring Health Insurance not in Cafeteria Plan








Employee & Spouse Coverage







Employee Coverage Based on Married With 0 Dependents Figuring Health Insurance not in Cafeteria Plan





22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
23	
24	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-17-1117 is amended to read as follows:
25	(a) Beginning on October 1, 2004, local school districts shall pay the health insurance
26	contribution of one hundred thirty one dollars (\$131) per month for each eligible
27	employee electing to participate in the public school employees' health insurance
28	program.
29	(b) (1) (A) <u>Beginning on October 1, 2009</u> the Department of Education shall pay the
30	Employee Benefits Division of the Department of Finance and Administration a

31 minimum of sixty one (\$61.00) sixty five percent (65%) per month of the total cost 32 for each eligible employee's health insurance program administered by the State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Board. 33 34 (B) The Department of Education shall make the total contributions under 35 subdivision (b)(1)(A) of this section by transferring thirty-five million dollars 36 (\$35.000,000) to the division funds in eleven (11) equal monthly installments. 37 (2) The funds provided to the division under this subsection shall be administered 38 by the board for the benefit of the employee participants of the public school 39 employees' health insurance program. 40 (3) (A) In the event that appropriation or funding is not provided, the 41 department shall not be responsible for the increased payments for the public school 42 employees' health insurance program as established by this section. 43 (B) If funding and appropriation are provided but are inadequate for the 44 total number of employees electing to participate in the public school employees' 45 health insurance program, the department shall pay a proportional share on behalf 46 of each participant to be implemented in increments over a five year period. 47 (C) If funding and appropriation are provided and exceed the amount 48 needed to make the minimum contribution under subdivision (b) (1) (A) of this 49 section, the department shall pay a proportional share of the excess on behalf of 50 each participant. 51 (1) A school district shall: (c) 52 (A) Provide the same employee-provided health insurance benefits for all 53 full-time school district employees; and 54 (B) Pay the same employer contribution rate for each eligible employee electing to participate in the public school employees' health insurance program. 55 56 (2) If a school district entered into a contract with a superintendent, teacher, or 57 other personnel prior to April 11, 2006, and the contract provides for a higher 58 employer contribution rate than paid for a majority f the certified personnel in the 59 school district, then the school district may continue to pay the higher contribution 60 rate as provided under the existing contract but not under extensions, addendums, or 61 new contracts created after April 11, 2006, without increasing all other employees 62 to the same rate. 63 (3) Any school district that entered into contracts with classified personnel prior to 64 July 31, 2007 and the contracts provided for a higher employer contribution funding

amount then is paid for certified personnel in the school district shall freeze the	
employer contribution funding amount for classified employees until such time	as
the funding amount contributed for certified personnel equals or exceeds the	
funding amount provided for classified employees.
