Representative Dalby called the meeting to order.

Consideration to Approve the March 4, 2024, Meeting Minutes [Exhibit B]

Representative Richmond made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Representative Nicks Jr., and the motion carried.

Discussion of Financial Matters Related to the Courts Legislative Study

Hon. Blake Batson, Circuit Judge, Arkansas Ninth East Judicial Circuit, and Kristin Clark, Director, Legal Services Division, Administrative Office of the Courts, presented an overview of the administrative plan that was mandated in Administrative Order Number 14 by the Arkansas Supreme Court. This plan enables a district court judge to handle pending matters in circuit courts, including protective orders, unlawful detainers, and warrants. Judge Batson emphasized the beneficial impact of this plan on law enforcement, ensuring the availability of a judge at all times for affidavits and search warrants.

Mark Whitmore, Chief Legal Counsel, Association of Arkansas Counties (AAC); Taylor Handford, Law Clerk, AAC; Hon. Rusty McMillon, President of County Judges' Association of Arkansas and County Judge, Greene County, and Blake Gary, Legal Counsel, Arkansas Municipal League; provided a discussion on the financial revenues, funds, and expenditures affecting judicial courts at the circuit and district level. Mr. Handford raised recurring concerns, primarily focusing on fees for installment payments, cost-sharing agreements, and fines imposed on defendants. He highlighted that revenue from these fees and fines are directed to the State Administration of Justice Fund.
