3 REQUESTING THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE, AND
4 LABOR STUDY METHODS TO INCREASE HEALTHCARE CHOICES AND ACCESS TO
5 MATERNITY, PRENATAL, POSTNATAL, AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTHCARE BY
6 UTILIZING CERTIFIED NURSE MIDWIVES.

8 WHEREAS, a number of the citizens of this state struggle with obtaining
9 maternity, prenatal, postnatal, and reproductive healthcare services; and

10
11 WHEREAS, individuals, especially those residing in rural areas of the
12 state, often drive hours to get to a healthcare provider who offers
13 maternity, prenatal, postnatal, and reproductive healthcare services; and

14
15 WHEREAS, certified nurse midwives are licensed by the Arkansas State
16 Board of Nursing and are authorized under § 17-87-102 to perform nursing
17 practices "that are relevant to the management of women's health care,
18 focusing on pregnancy, childbirth, the postpartum period, care of the
19 newborn, family planning, and gynecological needs of women within a
20 healthcare system that provides for consultation, collaborative management,
21 or referral as indicated by the health status of the client"; and

23 WHEREAS, certified nurse midwives are often underutilized in helping to
24 provide maternity, prenatal, postnatal, and reproductive healthcare services
25 in this state; and

27 WHEREAS, to increase healthcare provider choices and access to
28 maternity, prenatal, postnatal, and reproductive healthcare services for the
29 citizens of this state, the General Assembly should consider methods to
30 properly utilize certified nurse midwives,

32 NOW THEREFORE,

33 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE, AND LABOR OF
34 THE NINETY-SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY:

1 THAT the House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor study
2 methods to increase healthcare choices and access to maternity, prenatal,
3 postnatal, and reproductive healthcare services for the citizens of this
4 state by utilizing certified nurse midwives.
