WHEREAS, certified nurse midwives are licensed by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing and are authorized under § 17-87-102 to perform nursing practices "that are relevant to the management of women's health care, focusing on pregnancy, childbirth, the postpartum period, care of the newborn, family planning, and gynecological needs of women within a healthcare system that provides for consultation, collaborative management, or referral as indicated by the health status of the client"; and

WHEREAS, certified nurse midwives are often underutilized in helping to provide maternity, prenatal, postnatal, and reproductive healthcare services in this state; and
