5 WHEREAS, research demonstrates that access to an athletic trainer saves 6 lives, improves quality of life, decreases missed work days, and decreases 7 healthcare associated costs; and

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9 WHEREAS, there is an immediate need for athletic trainers in the State 10 of Arkansas but it is difficult to recruit to those positions in this state 11 because other states allow a broader scope of practice; and

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WHEREAS, to increase patient access to health care, reduce healthcare costs, and promote efficient and timely health care in the State of Arkansas, the General Assembly should modernize the scope of practice laws for athletic trainers to reflect the Role Delineation Study/Practice Analysis issued by the Board of Certification for the Athletic Trainer and the most recent educational standards of the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education,
