     under subdivision (18)(A)(i)(c)(2) of this section if delegated to do so by a
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     supervising pharmacist, but may not administer other medications.
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           SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-92-101, concerning the definitions
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     relating to pharmacy, pharmacists, and pharmacy technicians, is amended to
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     add additional subdivisions to read as follows:
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                 (27) "Infant" means a child less than eight (8) months of age;

                 (28) "Respiratory syncytial virus disease" means a respiratory
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     infection of the nose, throat, and lungs caused by the respiratory syncytial
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    virus.
