| 23 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: |
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| 25 | SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 11-9-514(a), concerning medical services |
| 26 | and supplies and a change of physician under the Workers' Compensation Law, |
| 27 | is amended to read as follows: |
| 28 | (a)(1) If the employee selects a physician, the Workers' Compensation |
| 29 | Commission shall not authorize a change of physician unless the employee |
| 30 | first establishes to the satisfaction of the commission that there is a |
| 31 | compelling reason or circumstance justifying a change. |
| 32 | (2)(A)(i) If the employer selects a physician to encourage |
| 33 | continuity of care and improved outcomes, the claimant may petition the |
| 34 | commission one (1) time only for a change of physician, and if the commission |
| 35 | approves the change with or without a hearing, the commission shall determine |
| 36 | the second physician and shall not be bound by recommendations of claimant or |

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| 2 | (ii) A physician may make appropriate referrals to |
