Update on Department of Human Services (DHS) Response to Government Shutdown and TANF Funding Impact

Janet Mann, Secretary, DHS; Misty Eubanks, Deputy Secretary for Operations and Budget, DHS; Lori McDonald, Chief of Staff, DHS; and Mary Franklin, Director of the Division of County Operations, DHS; discussed DHS's plan to delay furloughs and issue benefits at 65% due to the federal government's decision to issue funding to Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients through November. Community partners' programs funded through the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, Social Servies, and the Community Services grant are currently suspended.
