11 THAT the Senate Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor study 12 the process and procedures that currently exist for declaring a public health 13 emergency for the state or the majority of its counties, including without 14 limitation the types of administrative actions that may be taken as part of 15 such an emergency, and consider whether legislative revisions are appropriate 16 in the future to provide greater legislative involvement in those processes 17 and procedures.

BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that when conducting the study, the Senate Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor invite the participation of the House Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor as well as the Senate Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs and the House Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs.
