- G. Department of Human Services (DHS), Division of County Operations, Review of a Rule which revises Medical Services Policy Manual B-700 Transitional Medicaid. This rule must be promulgated to ensure coverage for Transitional Medicaid which is required by 42 U.S.C.§1396-r. This program is for families who were previously receiving Parent/Caretaker Relative Medicaid coverage and lost it due to increased wages or increased hours of employment. **[EXHIBIT G]**

Medical Services is deleting specific brand names for nutritional formulas in Hyperalimentation and Prosthetics Provider Manuals. This change will reduce the need for frequent rule revisions pertaining to nutritional formulae. In addition, the MIC-KEY brand name for Low-Profile button feeding tubes is being removed from the provider manuals and the Arkansas Medicaid State Plan. The basis and purpose of this rule is to implement an electronic visit verification (EVV) system for in-home personal care services, attendant care, respite services paid by Medicaid, as required by section 12006 of the 21st Century Cures Act (42 U.S.C. § 1396b(1)) compels the Arkansas Medicaid program to require all personal care providers to use EVV for in-home services on and after December 1, 2020. DHS has no way to implement this requirement except through promulgation of a rule. **[EXHIBIT I]**
