The Arkansas Department of Health will hold a public hearing on August 11, 2021 at 10:00 AM at the 4815 West Markham Street, Room 2508, at Little Rock, Arkansas, to allow interested persons to comment on the proposed adoption of Rules for the Arkansas Central Cancer Registry pursuant to Act 345 of 2021, An Act to Remove Barriers to the Release of Data in the Arkansas Central Cancer Registry to Qualified Cancer Researchers.

This proposed amendment to the Arkansas Department of Health Rules pertaining to Lead-Based Paint changes the clearance levels for lead in dust to meet industry standards. This rule change amends the definition of "Dust-lead hazard" to mean a surface dust in a residential dwelling or child-occupied facility that contains a mass-per-area concentration of lead equal to or exceeding $10 \mu \mathrm{~g} / \mathrm{ft} 2$ (micrograms per square foot) on floors or $100 \mu \mathrm{~g} / \mathrm{ft} 2$ on interior windowsills based on wipe samples.

In December 2020, EPA announced a new action to better protect American children from the dangers of lead. The Final Rule lowers the clearance levels for the amount of lead that can remain in dust on floors and windowsills after lead removal activities. EPA's new clearance levels are 10 micrograms ( $\mu \mathrm{g}$ ) of lead in dust per square foot (ft2) for floor dust and $100 \mu \mathrm{~g} / \mathrm{ft} 2$ for windowsill dust, lower than the previous levels of $40 \mu \mathrm{~g} / \mathrm{ft} 2$ for floor dust and $250 \mu \mathrm{~g} / \mathrm{ft} 2$ for windowsill dust. These new clearance levels will reduce lead dust-related risks to children in pre-1978 homes and childcare facilities where lead abatement activities take place. The EPA requires state's update their Rules to reflect this change by January 1, 2022.
