Department of Human Services (DHS), Division of County Operations, Review of Rule regarding changes to Medical Services Policy Section B-220 Newborns which outlines the factors that are used to determine the eligibility of newborn categories. Newborns are guaranteed Medicaid coverage for the first year of life regardless of income changes. (EXHIBIT H)
