## $90 \%$ of the MKARNS is already at $12^{\prime}$ depth

## Economic Benefits

In 2011 , over 10 million tons transported on the MKARNS

The MKARNS currently transports nearly 3 billion dollars worth of commodities


## Economic Benefits

Value of cargo rising MKARNS has about 65 ports and terminals


## Economic Benefits

Provide increased access to major ports
Port of South Louisiana, Port of New Orleans


## Economic Benefits

In 2011, more than 17 billion dollars in agricultural products exported through Louisiana ports

## Environmental Benefits

Average Barge Tow
Per ton per gallon:
515 miles by barge
202 miles by rail
59 miles by truck

Average Barge Rates:

50\% lower than rail

90\% lower than tractor trailers

## Environmental Benefits

Reduced emissions
One barge ( 1500 tons) $=60$ tractor trailers
With a 1 2' channel, one barge can hold 2000 tons $=$ 80 tractor trailers

## What Are The Challenges We Face?

Waterways are funded by $\nless 20$ per gallon tax on commercial users
The fund is empty because of major cost overruns on major projects (Olmsted Lock and Dam project)
