(c) A chair and vice chair of the board shall be selected annually by 2 and from the membership of the board and shall serve no more than two (2) 3 years. 4

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SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 21-5-404 is amended to read as follows: 21-5-404. Powers, functions, and duties of board.

The State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Board has the 8 following powers, functions, and duties: 9

- (1)(A) To explore various cost-containment measures and funding options for plan options offered under the State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Program for the benefit of state employees, state employee 12 retirees, public school employees, and public school employee retirees. 13
- (B) Beginning in the 2015 plan year, the board shall not 14 adopt a health insurance plan option that has no deductible for participants; 15
 - (2) To promote competition among vendors and create a systematic formula for measuring competitiveness of the plan options offered under the program, quality-of-care delivery, portability, and accessibility to and affordability of health care;
 - (3) To prepare a comprehensive analysis of the various plan options offered under the program, including cost, quality, and access differentials as well as any other comparisons of the plan options offered under the program;
 - (4) To undertake studies and to take any appropriate action that the board determines will promote the financial soundness and overall wellbeing of the program;
 - (5) To establish and set penalties as allowed under § 21-5-415;
 - (6)(A) To develop, with the assistance of the Office of State Procurement, bid specifications and requests for proposals and to evaluate bids and proposals.
- The board shall allow the office to execute all other 31 actions relating to the purchasing procedures in contracting for consultants, 32 third-party administrators, providers, or insurance companies on behalf of 33 the program and all plan options offered under the program; 34
- (7) To evaluate responses to requests for proposals, select 35 contractors for all services, and approve the award of contracts resulting 36

from bids for the program and all plan options offered under the program; 1 (8) To perform program and plan option design, summarize plan 2 document approval, including without limitation lifetime limitations, 3 copayments, deductibles, and eligibility rules; 4 (9) To promote increased access to and participation in the 5 program and the plan options offered under the program by educating state 6 employees, state employee retirees, public school employees, and public 7 school employee retirees about the program and all plan options offered under 8 the program, including the advantages and disadvantages of each available 9 10 plan option; (10)(A) To direct the office to contract with qualified vendors, 11 as defined by the board, offering the plan options under the program as 12 prescribed by the board without regard to § 19-11-228 or other statutes 13 requiring competitive bidding. 14 (B) Each contract shall be for a term of at least one (1) 15 year but may be made automatically renewable from term to term in the absence 16 of notice of termination by either party; 17 (11)(A) To obtain quality-of-care information from systems, 18 networks, hospitals, and clinical providers to inform plan option design, 19 plan option management, and consumer decisions. 20 (B) The board shall: 21 (i) Use accepted national standards for assessment 22 of quality-of-care information provided by systems, networks, hospitals, and 23 clinical providers; and 24 (ii) Be empowered to: 25 (a) Determine the appropriate use of quality-26 of-care information and scope of system, network, hospital, and clinical 27 provider accountability; 28 (b) Request aggregate performance information 29 for patients; and 30 Publicly report conclusions of quality-of-(c) 31 care assessment; and 32 (12) To appoint three (3) subcommittees of the board to study 33 and research plan options offered under the program, formulary management, 34 quality of care provided, and the financial impact of implementing the 35 recommendations made to the board as follows: 36

14	(a) Three (3) pharmacists as follows:		
15	(1) The Executive Director of the		
16	Arkansas State Board of Pharmacy or his or her pharmacist designee;		
17	(2) The Dean of the University of		
18	Arkansas for Medical Sciences College of Pharmacy or his or her pharmacist		
19	designee; and		
20	(3) A pharmacist selected by the		
21	Arkansas Pharmacists Association;		
22	(b) Four (4) physicians as follows:		
23	(1) The Dean of the University of		
24	Arkansas for Medical Sciences College of Medicine or his or her physician		
25	designee;		
26	(2) The Senior Associate Hospital		
27	Director of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences Medical Center or		
28	his or her physician designee;		
29	(3) The Medical Director of the Arkansas		
30	Poison and Drug Information Center or his or her physician designee; and		
31	(4) A physician selected by the Arkansas		
32	Medical Society;		
33	(c) One (1) registered nurse who is the Dean		
34	of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences College of Nursing or his		
35	or her registered nurse designee; and		
36	(d) One (l) state employee and one (l) two (2)		

1	public school employees appointed by the board, each of whom has		
2	expertise in accounting, finance, auditing, or insurance.		
3	(ii) The Drug Utilization and Evaluation		
4	Subcommittee of the State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Board		
5	shall review drugs for formulary management and evaluate the financial impact		
6	of its recommendations; and		
7	(C)(i) The Quality of Care Subcommittee of the State and		
8	Public School Life and Health Insurance Board shall consist of:		
9	(a) Three (3) board members;		
10	(b) Two (2) state employees;		
11	(c) Two (2) public school employees;		
12	(d) One (1) representative from the Arkansas		
13	Foundation for Medical Care;		
14	(e) One (l) representative from the Arkansas		
15	Pharmacists Association;		
16	(f) One (1) representative from the Arkansas		
17	Center for Health Improvement;		
18	(g) One (l) representative from the Arkansas		
19	Medical Association;		
20	(h) One (l) representative from the Arkansas		
21	Osteopathic Medical Association; and		
22	(i) One (1) representative from the Arkansas		
23	Hospital Association.		
24	(ii) The Quality of Care Subcommittee of the State		
25	and Public School Life and Health Insurance Board may review and recommend		
26	quality performance indicators for use, recommend baseline performance goals,		
27	recommend alignment of financial incentives to improve performance, and track		
28	improvements in delivery of care.		
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
