I am writing to advise you of my intention to step aside as the Vice Chair of the State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Program Legislative Task Force. However, the end result is an employee health insurance benefits system for both state employees and public school employees that will serve the needs of its participants into the foreseeable future.
