15	(c) The Secretary of State shall assist the House Committee on State		
16	Agencies and Governmental Affairs and the Senate Committee on State Agencies		
17	and Governmental Affairs with any information needed to complete the study		
18	required under this section.		
19	(d) Joint meetings for purposes of conducting the study required under		
20	this section shall be held at the call of the Chair of the House Committee on		
21	State Agencies and Governmental Affairs and the Chair of the Senate Committee		
22	on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs.		
23	(e) On or before November 30, 2022, the House Committee on State		
24	Agencies and Governmental Affairs and the Senate Committee on State Agencies

26	written report of their activities, findings, and recommendations with regard		
27	to the study required under this section, including without limitation:
