


NATIONAL ACCLAIM



CREATIVITY + INNOVATION COMPLEX

The \$4.7 million facility marks the first new academic facility in ASMSA history. The CIC includes learning spaces that support computer science, technology, entrepreneurship, digital arts, and music. Additionally, the Oaklawn Foundation Community Center gives the school a space in which all campus community members can gather under one roof for the first time.



CONVENT + CHAPEL RENOVATION

The project is estimated at \$3.5 million and would add an additional 24 beds to enrollment while also providing additional community space, staff housing, and offices for Residential Life.

Governor Hutchinson has already provided a \$1 million commitment for the project and an national foundation has made a preliminary \$1 million loan commitment to support the project.



RESIDENTIAL EXPERIENCE OVERVIEW

ASMSA offers a program not only where students can connect with intellectual peers but also live and learn alongside other young people from diverse backgrounds.








