100 FAMILIES

100 Families is a **community-led initiative** to help families move from crisis to stability and onto a career using **existing community resources** by:

- engaging community partners
- training agencies on a collaborative case management system
- and recruiting case managers to respond when a family is in crisis



FAMILIES WE SERVE



1 out of 3 of parents had a suspended driver's license



43% of parents had been victim of domestic violence



31% of parents had been convicted of a felony



72% of parents had been to jail or prison



Nearly half of the families were in need of childcare services



1 out of every 5 families had no income and didn't have SNAP



Half of all families had no income from any source



47% of parents did not have their GED or high school diploma



1 out of four families was homeless.







What is HopeArk used for?



TANF Eligibility Determination: Clients sign an electronic release form in HopeArk allowing Restore Hope to verify their TANF eligibility through DHS. Restore Hope's eligibility specialist then coordinates between DHS and case managers to ensure that **all clients are verified either by DHS or supporting documentation**. This eligibility information then is shared between all organizations who are using HopeArk, **reducing administrative cost and burden on organizations**, and giving ADWS a real-time look into the verification status of TANF-funded clients.



Data Collection: Clients are **assessed** by a trained case manager using a **standardized** needs assessment in **thirteen** areas of need, and a plan is made to address the client's areas of highest need. This assessment is updated on a monthly basis, allowing us to collect **real-time data** regarding the progress and outcomes of clients **across the state**, all using the same measurement tools.



Compliant Communication: Electronic consent forms are signed by all clients, allowing referrals to be made directly in HopeArk and for all providers working with the client to **communicate** about the client's progress and **work as a team** to help clients move from crisis to career, ultimately reducing duplication of services.



Resolving Legal Issues: A Court Resolution Report is completed on all TANF-eligibile clients in the system, with information on what clients need to do to resolve any outstanding legal issues, particularly with the goal of **reinstating clients' driver's license**





BY THE END OF 2023

The 100 Families Initiative will be operational in the ten largest counties in Arkansas Pulaski, Benton, Washington, Sebastian, Faulkner, Saline, Craighead, Garland, White, and Lonoke counties; representing 54% of Arkansas' population.

BY THE END OF 2024

The 100 Families Initiative will be operational in the 25 largest counties in Arkansas: all listed above, Lonoke, Jefferson, Pope, Crawford, Crittenden, Greene, Miller, Baxter, Mississippi, Union, Independence, Boone, Hot Spring, Carroll, Johnson, and St. Francis counties; representing 75% of Arkansas' population.

BY THE END OF 2025

The 100 Families Initiative will be operational in the 50 largest counties in Arkansas: all listed above, Cleburne, Poinsett, Columbia, Ouachita, Clark, Hempstead, Logan, Yell, Conway, Ashley Polk, Drew, Grant, Phillips, Randolph, Franklin, Arkansas, Sharp, Sevier, Jackson, Marion, Van Buren, Cross, Lawrence, and Madison counties; representing 92% of Arkansas' population.

BY THE END OF 2026

The 100 Families initiative will be operational in all 75 Arkansas counties, representing 100% of Arkansas' population.


