Dear Vincent:

In response to your request, I am pleased to present the LexisNexis recommendations for volume replacements in 2021-2023 for the *Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated*. Enclosed is also a listing of all bound volumes with supplement sizes.

As you know, we are in a unique situation in that last year the Code Commission broke with long-standing tradition and only identified one year of replacement volumes. This creates a work-flow issue in that to keep on schedule in any given year, LexisNexis must work-up part of our replacement volume duties in advance of handing off to your office. Often this time frame occurs long before a suitable Code Commission meeting in which to identify replacement volumes occurs. Thus, unless we are pro-active and name these replacement volumes well in advance the smooth handoff of operational procedures between the State and LexisNexis is at jeopardy.

The Code Commission can solve this issue by adopting the three- year plan set out below, allowing both the state and LexisNexis to strategically plan work in the most productive and efficient manner in order to greatly benefit all Arkansas constituents.

2021-2023 Volume Replacement

LexisNexis proposes publishing four volumes in 2021, eight volumes in 2022 and four volumes in 2023. While this may appear as a relatively high number, we have over the last few bienniums replaced fewer volumes than in the past which has resulted in many disproportionally large supplements and it would be beneficial to replace a greater number of volumes in order to make sure that the Code of Arkansas remains easy to use for practitioners. Furthermore, five of the volumes in need of replacement are recommended as "splits," very necessary for upkeep of the code but less onerous on staff resources.

The list below sets out the general factors considered in replacement volume analysis and the specific application of those factors to the replacement volume candidates that we recommend. The attached chart gives additional detail about these, as well as, all other volumes in the Code.

LexisNexis recommends replacement of 16 volumes from the list of twenty below. To keep the growth of the supplement in check, we propose replacing four in 2021, eight in 2022 and four in 2023.

- **3A:** Large supplement.
- 4A and 4B, 5: All have stand-alone supplements. Recommend splitting into 4 volumes.
- **6B:** Supplement is stand-alone size.
- **7B:** Large supplement with volume last done in 2012. Popular with practitioners.
- 8A: Explosion of pages since done in 2016; stand-alone supplement.
- **13A and 13B:** Although last done in 2016, 13A has a stand-alone supplement. Recommend doing both 13A and 13B together in order to more properly arrange material in volumes.
- 21: Last done in 2016, with a stand-alone supplement. Recommend a volume split.
- **24B:** A large volume with a stand-alone supplement, a split is recommended.
- **25A and B:** Both these volumes have very large supplements, and a split volume is recommended for 25B.
- **28A and B:** Department renamed in 2017. Volumes last done in 2014 and 2010. 28A has a stand-alone supplement and 28B's supplement is quite large. Recommend splitting into 3 volumes.

Price Adjustment

Pursuant to Section 3 of the contract, LexisNexis is also requesting the Commissions' approval for the following modest price adjustments for all purchases:

Please note that the Cumulative Supplement proposed price increase would not be effective until the 2023 supplement.
