- ABC Arkansas Better Chance: State-funded preschool program for children from lowincome families. Administered by OEC within ADE.
- HS / EHS Head Start / Early Head Start: Federally funded programs supporting school readiness, often operated by local nonprofits and community action agencies.
- ADE Arkansas Department of Education: Now houses the Office of Early Childhood (OEC), signaling stronger integration of Pre-K with K-12 systems, educator pipelines, and longitudinal data.
- OEC Office of Early Childhood: Formerly under DHS, now part of ADE. Oversees ABC, Better Beginnings (QRIS), licensing coordination, and early learning standards. Central to Arkansas's PDG B-5 system-building efforts.
- DESE Division of Elementary and Secondary Education: A division within ADE focused on K-12 policy, now more closely aligned with early childhood through OEC.

Funding & Policy Tools

- CCDF / CCDBG Child Care and Development Fund / Block Grant: Arkansas uses these federal dollars to support child care subsidies for families who are working or in school and quality initiatives.
- PDG B-5 Preschool Development Grant Birth through Five: Arkansas received 1 time PDG funding to strengthen its early childhood system, including data coordination and family engagement. (Ends Dec 2025)
- ARPA / CARES American Rescue Plan Act / CARES Act: Provided emergency stabilization funds to Arkansas child care providers during COVID.
- CTC / CDTC Child Tax Credit / Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit: Federal tax supports that impact Arkansas families' ability to afford care.
- -ABC Arkansas Better Chance: State-funded preschool program for children from lowincome families. Administered by OEC within ADE.
- HS / EHS Head Start / Early Head Start: Federally funded programs supporting school readiness, often operated by local nonprofits and community action agencies.

- CDA Child Development Associate: Credential supported by Arkansas's workforce development efforts.

- AACF Arkansas Advocates for Children and Families: Key player in early childhood policy, equity, and funding advocacy.
