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






Actual Trust Fund Usage Year-to-Date SFY13: \$151,000,000



MEDICAID POLICY CHANGES OCTOBER – DECEMBER 2012

Effective Date 10-1-12	The Targeted Case Management Program for 60 and older was updated to include qualifications; assistance with or arrangement for assistance with applications and paperwork as covered services; and time spent recording documentation as a billable service. It was also updated to change the amount of services available for beneficiaries age 21 and older to 50 hours per SFY.
10-1-12	The Episodes of Care provide policy manual was created as part of the new payment improvement initiative, which uses episode-based data to incentivize improved care quality, efficiency and economy. The first episodes included were: Perinatal Care; Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and Acute Ambulatory Upper Respiratory Infection (URI).
10-1-12	A new Autism Waiver policy manual was included in the Medicaid Program.
10-1-12	The Personal Care program was updated to comply with Act 560 of the 2011 Regular Session which allows Assisted Living Facilities (ALF) to bill Medicaid for Personal Care services with the same reimbursement methodology as Residential Care Facilities (RCF).
