Summary of Proposed Changes to the 2006 Arkansas State Plumbing Code Regarding Lead Free Plumbing

Currently, federal safe drinking water law allows plumbing pipes, fittings, and fixtures that carry drinking water to have as much as 8 percent lead. However, as a result of changes in the federal safe drinking water act in January 2011, the standard will change so that the wetted surface of such plumbing potable water pipes and fittings cannot contain more than a weighted average of 0.25% lead. The effective date of this new federal law is January 2014. Because of this, it is necessary to modify several sections of the state plumbing code to address the 0.25% requirement of the safe drinking water act.
