SUBJECT: Communicable Disease Section XXI Venereal Disease

DESCRIPTION: These revisions update the Communicable Disease Rules and Regulations Section XXI-Veneral Disease regarding Syphilis testing requirements during pregnancy to meet Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Guidelines for communities and populations in which the prevelance of Syphilis is high and for patients at high risk. Arkansas is ranked in the top five states for congenital Syphilis. This change is necessary to protect women and their babies from the serious consequences of Syphilis if not treated.

The change will require that a second serologic test for Syphilis be performed on women during the third trimester, ideally at 28 to 32 weeks' gestation.

PUBLIC COMMENT: A public hearing was held on this rule on November 8, 2013. The public comment period expired November 8, 2013. The Department received no public comments.

Isaac Linam, an attorney with the Bureau of Legislative Research, asked the following question:

QUESTION: I see these treatment guidelines are dated 2010. Are these the most recent guidelines? If not, have the relevant sections of these guidelines been changed since 2010? **RESPONSE:** These are most recent ones.

The proposed effective date for the final rule is February 23, 2014.

CONTROVERSY: This is not expected to be controversial.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: The cost is \$7 per test and is covered by insurance, including Medicaid.

LEGAL AUTHORIZATION: Ark. Code Ann. § 20-7-109 provides that the Department of Health promulgate reasonable rules to protect public health and safety and to suppress and prevent infectious, contagious, and communicable diseases.

The latest Centers for Disease Control guidelines relating to syphilis testing during pregnancy are found in the CDC's Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report, December 17, 2010, Vol. 59, No. RR-12, pg. 35. The guidelines state that in areas with a high prevalence of syphilis and for high risk patients, serologic testing of syphilis should be performed early in the third trimester.

Summary of Proposed Changes to Rules and Regulations Pertaining to Communicable Disease

It is proposed to revise the Rules and Regulations Pertaining to Communicable Disease Section XXI Venereal Disease pursuant to the procedures of the Administrative Procedures Act process, by the authority of Act 434 of 1967 as amended. These rules are adopted by the Arkansas Board of Health pursuant to the authority expressly conferred by the laws of the State of Arkansas including, without limitation Ark. Code Ann. §§20-15-109.
