SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-105-108, concerning prescriptive authority for a physician assistant, is amended to read as follows: 17-105-108. Prescriptive authority. (a) Physicians supervising physician assistants may delegate prescriptive authority to physician assistants to include prescribing, ordering, and administering Schedule III-V controlled substances as described in the Uniform Controlled Substances Act, §§ 5-64-101 - 5-64-510, and 21 C.F.R. Part 1300, all legend drugs, and all nonschedule prescription medications and medical devices. All prescriptions and orders issued by a physician assistant shall also identify his or her supervising physician. (b) A physician assistant may prescribe hydrocodone combination products reclassified from Schedule III to Schedule II as of October 6, 2014, if authorized by the physician assistant's supervising physician and in accordance with other requirements of this section. (b)(c) At no time shall a physician assistant's level of prescriptive authority exceed that of the supervising physician. (c)(d) Physician assistants who prescribe controlled substances must shall register with the Drug Enforcement Administration as part of the Drug Enforcement Administration's Mid-Level Practitioner Registry, 21 C.F.R.
