SUBJECT: Behavioral Health Services (DBHS) Certification Manual for Rehabilitative Services for Persons with Mental Illness (RSPMI) Update #2015-1

<u>DESCRIPTION</u>: Effective September 1, 2015, the department proposes to amend the outcomes reporting requirements in the DBHS Rehabilitative Services for Persons with Mental Illness (RSPMI) Certification Manual. This update is necessary to remove the requirement of RSPMI facilities to demonstrate use of the Youth Outcomes Questionnaire (YOQ) for certification purposes. This is pursuant to Act 161 of 2015.

PUBLIC COMMENT: A public hearing was not held on this rule. The public comment period expired May 26, 2015. The Department received no public comments.

Isaac Linam, an attorney with the Bureau of Legislative Research, asked the following questions:

QUESTION #1: Is the Youth Outcomes Questionnaire (YOQ) the "current outcomes measurement tool" referred to in Acts 2015, No. 161?

RESPONSE #1: Yes, the YOQ is the current outcomes measurement tool referred to in ACT 161 of 2015.

QUESTION #2: Is the new language added to this rule the "new outcomes measurement tool" referred to in Acts 2015, No. 161? If yes, can you briefly explain this new tool? If no, does the Department anticipate promulgating a rule to select a new outcomes measurement tool by the timetable set in Act 161?

RESPONSE #2: No, the language added here simply removes the requirement for a provider to show the usage of the YOQ to be certified by DBHS. The requirement now would be for the provider to show the tracking of outcomes (of their choosing) to be certified as an RSPMI site by DBHS. The new tool is mandated to be chosen by September 30, 2015 and new language will have to be promulgated which would specify that tool.

The proposed effective date for the final rule is November 1, 2015.

CONTROVERSY: This is not expected to be controversial.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: There is no financial impact.

<u>LEGAL AUTHORIZATION</u>: This rule implements in part Acts 2015, No. 161. That Act requires the Department to replace its current outcomes measurement tool regarding behavior health care services for children and youth by selecting a new

outcomes based measurement tool by September 30, 2015.

Ark. Code Ann. § 20-47-709 provides that the Department of Human Services shall promulgate rules to carry out the Arkansas System of Care for Behavioral Health Care Services for Children and Youth Act, codified as § 24-47-701 et seq.

Ark. Code Ann. § 20-76-201 authorizes the Department of Human Services to administer programs for the indigent and to "make rules and regulations" pertaining to the administration of those programs. Ark. Code Ann. § 20-77-107 specifically authorizes the Department to "establish and maintain an indigent medical care program."

Ark. Code Ann. § 25-10-129 directs the Department to promulgate rules to conform to federal law that affects "programs administered or funded by or through the department" as necessary to receive available federal funds.
