<u>DESCRIPTION</u>: The Pharmacy Manual, Section 213.20, Prescription Refill Limit is being updated to reflect that pharmacies will have a maximum of 14 days to reverse original prescriptions and refills that were not provided to the recipient.

<u>PUBLIC COMMENT</u>: No public hearing was held. The public comment period expired on December 15, 2015. The Department received no comments.

The proposed effective date is February 1, 2016.

CONTROVERSY: This is not expected to be controversial.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: There is no financial impact.

LEGAL AUTHORIZATION:

Arkansas Code Annotated § 20-76-201 (12) gives the Department the general authority to "make rules and regulations and take actions as are necessary or desirable to carry out the provisions of this chapter and that are not inconsistent therewith."

The purpose of this rule is to update current pharmacy rules so that pharmacies will have a maximum of 14 days to reverse original prescriptions and refills that were not provided to the recipient.
