Suicide Statistics

- 503 Arkansans died by suicide in 2014
- Arkansas ranks 16th nationally per capita in suicide deaths
- Suicide is the 11th leading cause of death in Arkansas
- Twice as many people died by suicide than by homicide in Arkansas in 2014

ADH Suicide Prevention Program Achievements

- Awareness Campaigns billboards, print and radio ads promoting the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline (NSPL), received Governor's proclamation declaring September as Suicide Prevention Awareness Month, local news coverage of suicide events, distribution of suicide prevention awareness materials at area fares and conferences
- Prevention Education safeTALK trainings around the state, purchase of training materials to support trainers, model policies sent to school counselors, planned presentations in area schools
- Community Collaboration -- ADH collaborates with the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, the Garland County Suicide Prevention Coalition, Arkansas Suicide Prevention Council, Arkansas Suicide Prevention Network, Central Arkansas Veterans Mental Health Council, and many others.
- Follow-up Care developed a follow-up plan and will utilize the clinicians we train this fall to gather data on follow up care in Pulaski, Saline, and Garland counties. We are developing an "after an attempt" care packet to distribute to hospital emergency departments

National Suicide Prevention Lifeline (NSPL) Call Center Data

- An average 909 Arkansans per month called the NSPL from January through July 2016
- 35% of the calls were from veterans
- From April to July, all calls were answered by out-of-state call centers
