24	SECTION 1. Arkansas	Code Title 20, Chapter	77, is amended to add an
25	additional subchapter to r	ead as follows:	
26	<u>Subchapter</u>	27 - Medicaid Managemen	t Reform Act
27			
28	20-77-2701. Title.		
29	This subchapter shal	l be known and may be ci	ted as the "Medicaid
30	Management Reform Act".		
31			
32	20-77-2702. Purpose		
33	The purpose of this subchapter is to support the reform model of the		
34	traditional Arkansas Medicaid Program with key requirements for the		
35	efficiency of the program,	_	ogram targets, and the
36	review of program activiti	es.	

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2	20-77-2703. Definition.
3	As used in this subchapter,
4	(1) "Health home" means the healthcare model of coordinated care
5	for individuals with chronic conditions, including mental health and
6	substance use disorders, as defined by 42 U.S.C. § 1396w-4, as it existed on
7	January 1, 2016; and
8	(2)(A) "Value-based purchasing strategy" means a broad set of
9	payment strategies that link financial incentives to the healthcare delivery
10	performance of a healthcare provider on a set of defined performance measures
11	that are designed to improve quality or reduce costs, or both.
12	(B) "Value-based purchasing strategy" includes contractual
13	arrangements where healthcare providers receive:
14	(i) A bonus payment for measureable performance in
15	quality, patient satisfaction, resource use, and cost; and
16	(ii) Lower payments for events and procedures that:
17	(a) Were avoidable;
18	(b) Do not promote quality; and
19	(c) Increase costs.
20	
21	20-77-2704. Value-based purchasing strategy.
22	(a) The Department of Human Services shall develop and implement a
23	comprehensive value-based purchasing strategy to ensure that the state
24	receives the highest possible value when purchasing healthcare services
25	through the Arkansas Medicaid Program in addition to the purchasing laws of
26	Arkansas, including without limitation § 19-11-101 et seq. and the Arkansas
27	Procurement Law, § 19-11-201 et seq.
28	(b) The value-based purchasing strategy may be implemented through the
29	<pre>program, including without limitation:</pre>
30	(1) Existing programs and strategies, including without
31	limitation the Patient-Centered Medical Home Program and the various episodes
32	of care; and
33	(2) New programs and strategies, including without limitation:
34	(A) Quality reporting for Medicaid providers;
35	(B) Health homes for Medicaid beneficiaries who are:
36	(i) Over sixty-five (65) years of age;

1	(ii) Diagnosed with a physical disability or a		
2	developmental disability; or		
3	(iii) Diagnosed with severe and persistent mental		
4	illness;		
5	(C) Reimbursement withholding pending satisfactory		
6	achievement on healthcare provider performance measures; and		
7	(D) Shared savings and shared risks for Medicaid		
8	providers.		
9			
10	20-77-2705. Project management.		
11	(a) Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this section, the		
12	Department of Human Services shall submit an implementation plan for the		
13	reform model of the traditional Arkansas Medicaid Program to the Governor and		
14	<u>Legislative Council.</u>		
15	(b) After the implementation plan is submitted, the department shall		
16	submit quarterly an implementation progress report to the Governor and		
17	Legislative Council.		
18	(c) Both the implementation plan and the implementation progress		
19	report shall describe:		
20	(1) The current status of the implementation;		
21	(2) The anticipated timeline for the implementation;		
22	(3) Any major milestones achieved;		
23	(4) All implementation risks; and		
24	(5) Any changes to the timeline described in subdivision (c)(2)		
25	of this section.		
26			
27	20-77-2706. Dashboard for operation metrics.		
28	(a) The Department of Human Services shall develop an online dashboard		
29	for the reporting of budget data, program performance data, and population		
30	health data regarding the Arkansas Medicaid Program.		
31	(b) The online dashboard shall include without limitation:		
32	(1) The number of applications received and processed;		
33	(2) The total enrollment numbers by eligibility group;		
34	(3) The new enrollment numbers by eligibility group since the		
35	<pre>last reporting;</pre>		
36	(4) The amount and number of paid claims by eligibility group;		

1	(5) The number of payments made for healthcare services		
2	associated with labor and delivery;		
3	(6) Medicaid provider performance measures;		
4	(7) Performance metrics for key contracts with the program;		
5	(8) Performance of all major savings initiatives contained in		
6	this subchapter and any other program reform measures;		
7	(9) Budget trend analysis for all Medicaid healthcare services		
8	spending, including all categories of Medicaid providers; and		
9	(10) The Medicaid beneficiary population health data, including		
10	without limitation information on diabetes, prescription adherence, and		
11	obesity.		
12	(c)(1) Within one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective date of		
13	this section, the online dashboard shall be submitted to the Legislative		
14	Council for review.		
15	(2) The Legislative Council may request changes to the online		
16	dashboard.		
17	(3) The online dashboard shall be implemented on or before		
18	January 1, 2017.		
19	(d) The online dashboard shall be updated no less than monthly.		
20			
21	20-77-2707. Duties of Legislative Council.		
22	(a) The Legislative Council shall:		
23	(1) Review whether expenditures of the Arkansas Medicaid Program		
24	are appropriate to accomplish state objectives for health care;		
25	(2) Review and approve proposed rules regarding the Arkansas		
26	Medicaid Program;		
27	(3)(A) Review proposed contracts of twenty-five thousand dollars		
28	(\$25,000) or more before the execution of the contracts.		
29	(B) The Department of Human Services shall provide a list		
30	of all contracts less than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to the		
31	Legislative Council on a monthly basis;		
32	(4) Oversee the development and implementation of the reform		
33	model of the program and this subchapter, including all recommendations		
34	approved by the Arkansas Health Reform Legislative Task Force;		
35	(5) Review reports filed with the Legislative Council, including		
36	without limitation reports filed under §§ 20-77-111, 20-77-1001, 20-77-2206,		

1	and 20-//-2509;	
2	(6) Review ongoing data collection, research, and evaluation of	
3	the program;	
4	(7) Review and recommend policies and changes for the program;	
5	<u>and</u>	
6	(8) Study other Medicaid-related and healthcare matters as the	
7	Legislative Council considers necessary to fulfill its mandate.	
8	(b)(1) Annually by December 15, the Legislative Council shall provide	
9	to the General Assembly:	
10	(A) Any analysis or findings resulting from its activities	
11	under this section that the Legislative Council deems relevant; and	
12	(B) Its recommendations for any changes to the program.	
13	(2) The Legislative Council may make interim reports to the	
14	General Assembly regarding the expenditures of the program.	
15	(c)(l) During a regular, fiscal, or extraordinary session of the	
16	General Assembly, the Joint Budget Committee shall perform the functions	
17	assigned to the Legislative Council under this subchapter.	
18	(2) This subsection does not limit the authority of the	
19	Legislative Council to meet during a recess as authorized by § $10-2-223$ or §	
20	10-3-211.	
21	(d) The Legislative Council and the Joint Budget Committee may:	
22	(1) Establish or utilize one (1) or more subcommittees to assist	
23	in their duties under this subchapter;	
24	(2) Assign information filed with the Legislative Council under	
25	this subchapter to one (1) or more subcommittees of the Legislative Council,	
26	including without limitation a subcommittee created under subdivision (d)(1)	
27	of this section; and	
28	(3) Delegate their duties under this subchapter to one (1) or	
29	more subcommittees of the Legislative Council, subject to the final approval	
30	of the Legislative Council or the Joint Budget Committee.	
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
