RSPMI – Audit and Review Observations

- OMIG review of 90853 Group Psychotherapy Billing
- OMIG review of Prior Authorization process for RSPMI
- Identify and analyze other RSPMI billing practices where Arkansas is a statistical outlier
- Assist in developing long term plan to reform the RSPMI program

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OMIG Recommendations for Reform

- Implement changes for Billing code 90853
 - Recommend a reduction from \$13.80 to \$10.00 for billable units
 - Recommend a reduction from 6 to 4 units allowed per session
 - Recommend a maximum payment rate of \$40.00 per day
 - Recommend a CAP on units per year for Group Psychotherapy (Providers may request additional therapy when appropriate.)

Projected Annual Cost Savings up to \$35 million

Recommend changes to Prior Authorization process

- 4/27/16: Met with representatives from the Mental Health Council of Arkansas regarding the recommended changes

- 7/5/16: Public comment period ended. Nine (9) comments were submitted
