## THE FAMILY CONNECTS UNIVERSAL NEWBORN NURSE HOME VISITING MODEL



**FOR ALL** 

Helping all families regardless of income or background



### **NO COST TO RECIPIENTS**

As an eligible recipient, you will not be charged



### **THREE WEEKS**

Visits are scheduled around 3 weeks after a baby's birth



### **REGISTERED NURSE**

All visits are made by highly trained nurses



As of October 2023, there are 30 community partners serving 19 states. From July 2022 to October 2023, 22303 families have received a visit.

## Family Connects International Current Community Partners

OUTCOME	RCTI	RCT II	LANCET STUDY
Maternal anxiety/depression	Mothers were <b>28%</b> less likely to report possible postpartum clinical anxiety	Mothers were <b>30%</b> less likely to experience possible postpartum depression or anxiety	RCT I-FC Black - Non-Hispanic White race disparity for anxiety reduced <b>48.3</b> %. Depression reduced <b>43.5</b> %. RCT II- Depression race disparity reduced by <b>24.4</b> %
Infant-father relationship quality	Higher quality infant-father relationship for intervention group	Similar levels of father-infant relationship quality between Intervention and control groups	RCT I- FC reduced Black-White race disparity in father non- support by <b>18.5</b> %. RCT II- no reduction in disparity
Infant ER care	ER visits and hospital overnight stays reduced by <b>50%</b> in first year of life.	Similar rates of emergency medical care episodes between birth-6 months.	RCT I- FC reduced Black-White race disparity for child ER care by <b>98.8%</b> . RCT II- <b>25.4</b> %
Child Maltreatment investigations	<b>39</b> % reduction in total CPS investigations for suspected abuse or neglect.	<ul> <li>44% lower rates of CPS investigations for suspected child abuse or neglect through age 2;</li> <li>39% lower investigation rates through age 5.</li> </ul>	RCT I- FC reduced Black-White race disparity in child maltreatment investigations by 38%. RCT II- 60.5%

\*Other outcomes of note: Community connections increased 16%/ Increase in postpartum visit completion



### PRIMARY PREVENTION of Child Maltreatment



#### What is Primary Prevention of Child Maltreatment? Stopping child abuse or neglect before it happens.

#### **PRIMARY PREVENTION**

Stop abuse **before** it occurs.

- Family strengthening & parent supports
- Universal home visiting
- Increasing economic supports for families
- Family-friendly workplace policies

#### SECONDARY PREVENTION

Immediate responses to target at-risk populations.

- Early Head Start
- Targeted home visiting
- Family First Prevention Services Act

#### TERTIARY PREVENTION

Long-term responses to stop abuse and neglect & minimize consequences.

- Foster Care
- Mental health & substance abuse programs

### Social and Emotional Competence

Children's early experiences of being nurtured and developing a *positive relationship* with caring adult *affects all aspects* of behavior and development.

## Knowledge of Parenting & Child Development

Children *thrive* when parents provide *not only affection*, but *also* respectful communication and listening, consistent

> rules and expectations, and **safe opportunities** that promote independence.

### Resilience

Parents who can cope with the stresses of everyday life, as well an occasional crisis, have resilience; they have the flexibility and inner strength necessary to bounce back when things are not going well.

*basic needs* for food, clothing, housing, and transportation—and who know how to access essential services such as childcare, health care, and mental health services to address

health care, and mental health services to address family-specific needs—are *better able to ensure the safety and well-being of their children*.



## FAMILY SUPPORT MATRIX DOMAINS

### **Support for Health Care**

- Maternal Health
- Infant Health
- Health Care Plans

### **Support for Infant Care**

- Child Care Plans
- Parent-Child Relationship
- Management of Infant Crying

### **Support for a Safe Home**

- Household Safety/Material Supports
- Family and Community Safety
- History with Parenting Difficulties

### Support for Parent(s)

- Parent Well Being
- Substance Use in Household
- Parent Emotional Support

Each factor is rated as:				
I = No family needs	3 = Community resources needed			
2 = Needs addressed during visit	4 = Emergency intervention needed			



## COMMON REFERRAL EXAMPLES BY MATRIX FACTOR

Support for a Safe Home	7. Household Safety/Material Supports	Housing Authority

	9. History with Parenting Difficulties	Parent Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT)
Support for Parent(s)	10. Parent Well Being	Mental Health Services
	II. Substance Use in Household	Substance Use Counseling
	12. Parent Emotional Support	Parent Support Groups







- 670 visits, population reach between 47-57%
- Some issues identified during visits
  - Post partum depression/anxiety
  - Maternal high blood pressure
  - Infant feeding problems
  - Education on infant crying
  - Safe sleep practices
  - Childcare resources
  - Parenting Education
