Mobility Impaired Licenses

Disability Impaired Licenses

- Resident 3-Year Disability Fishing License (RDF, \$10.50)
- Resident 3-Year Disability Hunting License (RDH, \$25)
- Resident 3-Year Disability Combination License (RDC, \$35.50)
- Resident Disabled Military Veteran Lifetime Fishing License (VLF, \$1.50)
- Resident Disabled Military Veteran Lifetime Hunting License (VLH, \$1.50)
- Resident Disabled Military Veteran Lifetime Combination License (VLC, \$3.00)
- Lifetime Waterfowl (VLD, \$7.00) and Trout Permits (VLT, \$10.00)
- Resident Disabled Military Veteran Lifetime Combination License (VLL, \$52.50)





Mobility Impaired Licenses

Mobility Impaired Access Permits

- Mobility-impaired access permit holders may use an ATV on Commissionowned WMAs to travel on graveled, all-weather roads (unless posted closed to vehicles) and on designated mobility-impaired access trails. They may use an ATV during muzzleloader and modern gun deer seasons with the following restrictions, for example:
 - ATVs may be used only for stand placement and hunting.
 - ATVs may be used beyond 300 feet from roads and designated mobility-impaired access trails only to retrieve game taken by the permit holder.
 - Permit holders must be able to see their ATV at all times while hunting.
 - Firearms must be unloaded and cased while being transported by ATV.
