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8	WHEREAS, guardianship is a state process in which a court gives a
9	person, the guardian, the duty and power to make personal and legal decisions
10	for another adult, the ward, who has been found to lack capacity to make
11	decisions for himself or herself; and
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13	WHEREAS, over one thousand (1,000) new adult guardianship petitions are
14	filed in Arkansas each year; and
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16	WHEREAS, each of these cases are required to be monitored by the courts
17	annually; and
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19	WHEREAS, the lack of proper monitoring in a guardianship can often lead
20	to abusive situations or the court losing track of an individual and his or
21	her resources; and
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23	WHEREAS, Arkansas's guardianship laws have not been substantially
24	updated since 1985,
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26	NOW THEREFORE,
27	BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON AGING, CHILDREN AND YOUTH,
28	LEGISLATIVE AND MILITARY AFFAIRS AND THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN AND
29	YOUTH OF THE NINETY-SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY:
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31	THAT the House Committee on Aging, Children and Youth, Legislative and
32	Military Affairs and the Senate Committee on Children and Youth shall study,
33	evaluate, and make recommendations for changes to state policy, rules, and
34	statutes that may assist in providing better protections and services for
35	individuals who may be at risk for abuse, neglect, or exploitation under the
36	current adult guardianship laws by reviewing:

(1) Current guardianship statutes to determine if changes may improve protections for elderly and vulnerable adults; (2) Guardianship services that are offered by the Department of Human Services; (3) Local-level efforts to provide guardianship services; and (4) Funding needs and the availability of funds for guardianship services, including without limitation an examination of existing and potential funding sources.
