STREAM QUALITY BEST PRACTICES

Nonpoint source contributions

- Local Cost Share Program
- Keeping livestock away from streams
- Protecting riparian areas
- Improving grazing lands
- Improve and/or replace septic/domestic sewage lines

Address point source limits

Examples

- Riparian and agricultural buffers
- Fencing and alternative animal trails and walkways
- Alternative watering sources for livestock
- Upgrade wastewater treatment systems discharging in watershed
