CWD Response Timeline

February 17

• 2.5-year-old cow elk tested positive for chronic wasting disease.

February 23

• Emergency Commission meeting for emergency approval of CWD Response Plan.

March 9

• 2.5-year-old female white-tailed deer near the Ponca Elk Education Center was confirmed CWD positive

•March 14-24

Phase I – Newton County Focal Area surveillance to determine disease prevalence

March 25 – present

Phase II - statewide surveillance to examine spatial distribution of disease

•June 24

AGFC Commission adopted CWD regulations for the 2016-2017 hunting season

Phase III Surveillance

1. Spatial Distribution of Disease/Gap Surveillance:

- Purpose: Define areas of disease concentration
- Hunter harvest samples taken within areas known to have CWD
- 25 CWD stations
 - DNA for microsatellite analysis
- Opening weekend of modern gun season

2. Focal Area Monitoring:

- Purpose: Monitor prevalence over time
- Newton/Pope counties
- Collect samples for 95% confidence at 1% prevalence inside the CWD focal areas
- Hunter harvest samples

3. Disease Detection Surveillance - Statewide:

- <u>Purpose:</u> Collect higher-probability samples for disease detection
- Road killed deer
- Target animals
- Mature bucks taxidermist
- Veterinarians

Phase III Results

Hunter Harvest Sampling


- November 12-13
 - 535 samples WTD
 - 2 Elk
- 67 Veterinarians
 - 7 vets have submitted samples
 - 17 samples submitted
- 49 Taxidermists
 - 6 currently reporting
 - 394 samples submitted

Total Hunter Harvest Sampling


- 1,136 total samples (from Sept 1)
