



White River Basin Study  
Arkansas State University and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers

Arkansas State University (A-State) and the US. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) are collaborating in the White River Basin Comprehensive Study to help understand the conditions and challenges faced by the people in the larger area of White River basin due to emerging changes in water use demands. Collaborations across multiple agencies and stakeholders are crucial for large basin-wide studies, especially when the expected tasks are complex due to the mixed nature of watershed usage, flood control, hydroelectric power, water supply, environmental stewardship and recreation, and water control plan. The ultimate goal of the study is to provide an updated comprehensive basin-wide study that examines all uses of water in the basin and assesses how well the system provides resources to meet those needs.
