Act 1222 of 2011 requires the Department of Higher Education, the Department of Education, and the Bureau of Legislative Research to jointly conduct a study of the fairness of the distribution of Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarships. The statute requires the agencies to provide progress reports and, by June 1, 2012, a final report to the Arkansas Lottery Commission Legislative Oversight Committee.

The Arkansas Lottery Commission Legislative Oversight Committee met together for two public hearings on April 9 and April 10, 2012. The final report is attached and submitted in accordance with the act.

Introduction

Act 1222 of 2011 requires the Arkansas Department of Higher Education, the Arkansas Department of Education, and the Bureau of Legislative Research to jointly conduct a study of the fairness of the distribution of Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarships funded by net proceeds of the Arkansas Lottery. It also requires the three agencies to provide progress reports and by June 1, 2012, a final report to the Arkansas Lottery Commission Legislative Oversight Committee. Specifically, the act requires a review of scholarship data concerning the race, gender, county of residence, transcript indication of learning disability, and financial need of applicants and subsequent recipients. The act further directs the three agencies to analyze the number and amount of scholarships awarded to students at all institutions of higher education, the barriers to applying for the scholarships encountered by students, and the reasons students did not qualify for scholarships. A copy of the act is included as Appendix A.

In compliance with the act, the Arkansas Lottery Commission Legislative Oversight Committee invited leaders of two- and four-year institutions of high education, high school guidance counselors, and academic coaches employed by the Department of Higher Education to join the committee in public hearings held April 9 and April 10, 2012. The results of the jointly conducted research follow with public comment and the final recommendation of the committee. The complete research documents submitted to the committee are included in Appendix B.

Research Summary

The Arkansas Department of Education provided K-12 student data to link with data maintained by the Arkansas Department of Higher Education on student applicants. This permitted student demographic information such as race, gender, and disability to be included in the analyses, although that information is not required as part of the scholarship application process. The results of those analyses follow.

In 2011, Arkansas had 33,328 Academic Challenge Scholarship (ACS) recipients, of which 19,900 were traditional students—students entering college the school year following their high school graduation. Table 1 shows the percentage of students that applied, were awarded scholarships, and renewed their scholarships in the second year. The number of awards is less than the number of total awards due to the inability to match high school records for all recipients. Results are also indicated for white and black applicants, and for applicants qualified for free/reduced school lunch and full price lunch applicants. All races are listed in the documentation provided in the appendix.

Higher percentages of females than males applied, were awarded, and were successful in renewing their ACS scholarships. Only 56 of 493 special education designated students applied in 2010. Less than one-third of these students were successful applicants, and only five students were able to renew their scholarship for the following year.

The data were broken down by county comparing lottery sales per person to the percent of students applying for traditional ACS, the percent awarded scholarships, and the percent of scholarships renewed. The full chart is provided in the appendix but the information below In Table 2 depicts the 2011 results for the three counties with the highest and lowest per-person lottery sales.

The data were also disaggregated by higher education institution. More scholarship recipients attended four-year colleges in both 2010 (70.6%) and 2011 (76.7%). The four-year institutions had a lower percentage of students who failed to renew their scholarship than the two-year institutions.

Finally, achievement data for traditional ACS students who renewed or failed to renew their scholarships were examined.

Public Comment

Representative Tracy Steele, lead sponsor of Act 1222 of 2011, stated that the purpose of the act was to create an evaluation of the scholarship process. There is still a challenge to ensure all students have the knowledge they need to apply for scholarships.

Representative Hyde stated the higher education GPA numbers may be distorted by those who are seeking certificate programs at two year schools. Those programs have different GPA requirements. He requested the student data used in the reports be uploaded into the ADHE COGNOS warehouse.

Shane Broadway, Interim Director, Department of Higher Education, shared these comments: ADHE would like to expand the career coaches program statewide, however, they are currently limited by funding, which is from various grants. ADHE also works closely with the Lottery Commission on advertising for scholarship promotion and education, and trains school counselors regarding scholarship requirements. A universal application, for all scholarships, is available on the ADHE website. There is a 41% drop-out rate in the scholarship program, which equals around \$27 million spent on students who did not renew in the second year. Most scholarship drop-outs are students who do not complete enough hours.

Students who do not have their scholarship renewed are still able to reapply or earn back their scholarship. If they earn back their scholarship, the student is then classified as a non-traditional student. Non-traditional applicants fall under a \$12 million spending cap, which limits the number of awards.

Carla Smith, Financial Aid Counselor, University of Arkansas System, said students are taking longer to complete their required hours, and there is a greater percentage of students taking five or more years to graduate. Freshman year requires a lot of adjustment for students, and many do not apply themselves during the first year. It isn't until grades come in, that many students start applying themselves. During the first year of the scholarship program, the push was to get the scholarships to the students, however, during the second year of the program, the push has been to educate students on how to retain their scholarship.

Additional discussion considered why eligible students are not applying for scholarships; whether certificate programs should be considered separately in the data; and the need to know whether students were offered but declined a scholarship or were determined to be ineligible. Concern was expressed about the number of students who do not complete their applications.

Recommendation

In response to concerns about students who would have been eligible for scholarships but did not apply, the following recommendation was moved and adopted:

There should be confirmation that each student has been notified about scholarship programs.

Stricken language would be deleted from and underlined language would be added to present law.
