

# The STAR Program

## Strategies for Teaching based on Autism Research

The STAR Program (Arick, Loos, Falco, Krug 2004) is a comprehensive curriculum for students with autism and other developmental disabilities. The information below is intended to answer commonly asked questions regarding the program.

#### The STAR Program meets the criteria of an evidence-based program.

- The STAR Program uses established treatments identified by the National Autism Center (National Standards Report, 2009)
   as a core instructional strategy.
- The core instructional strategies of discrete trial training, pivotal response training and teaching functional routines have been documented by over 30 years of research literature to be effective for teaching students with autism (National Professional Development Center, 2010).
- Two major studies on the STAR Program have found that students who received the STAR Program as part of their public school instruction made significant progress in several areas of development.
  - o The Autism Outcome Study (Arick, Young, Loos, Falco and Krug, 2003):
  - The Autism Instructional Methods Study (Randomized Clinical Trial, University of Pennsylvania, Center for Autism Research)

#### The STAR Program is a cost-effective solution for school districts.

- The STAR Program is a structured, manualized curriculum and includes assessments, lesson plans, data collection and
  extensive progress monitoring procedures. The program is designed to meet the needs of a range of students within a
  classroom, including students with developmental disabilities.
- Classrooms and training sites can be developed to model best-practice and fidelity of implementation. Establishing training sites at the district level will ensure sustainability of effective programs over time.
- Special education litigation has been found to be 10 times greater in the area of autism than other disabilities. Providing
  cost-effective, evidenced-based programs for students with autism directs valuable school resources to the students who
  will benefit the most from these programs.
