# AAL POST TERMINATION OF PARENTAL RIGHTS HEARING CHECKLIST

## Statutory Authority A.C.A. 19-27-360

## **Purpose:**

- ➤ Court shall determine if case plan, services and placement meet the special needs and best interest of the child.
- Court shall determine if DHHS has made reasonable efforts to finalize an appropriate permanent placement for the juvenile.
- ➤ Court shall determine if the case plan is moving toward an appropriate permanency plan for the juvenile. A.C.A. '9-27-360(b)

#### **Time constraints:**

- Shall be held at least 3 months following an order for termination of parental rights when the goal is adoption and in all other cases 6 months until permanency is achieved. A.C.A. '9-27-360(a)
- DHHS shall file a court report with the court, including a certificate of service that the report has been submitted to all parties and the CASA volunteer, if appointed, 7 business days prior to the scheduled review hearing. A.C.A. '9-27-361(a)(1)
- CASA volunteers shall provide written reports for the court and shall provide all parties or the attorney of record with a copy of the report 7 business days prior to the hearing. A.C.A. '9-27-316(g)(3)(A)(iii); §9-27-361(a)(1)
- A written order shall be filed and distributed to the parties within 30 days of the date of the hearing or prior to the next hearing, whichever is sooner. A.C.A. '9-27-360(d)

# **Present At Hearing:**

- ✓ Judge;
- ✓ Remaining Parties (agency and child). Child must be present unless excused for good cause by court;
- ✓ Attorneys for remaining parties;
- ✓ CASA volunteer, if appointed;
- ✓ Case worker, adoption specialist, and relevant witnesses:
- ✓ Foster parents or relative caregivers; and

✓ Court Reporter.

### **Issues:**

- Are the child's needs being met?
- Party's compliance with case plan and court orders.
- ➤ Appropriateness of case plan goal reviewed.

### **Pre-trial Preparations:**

- Ensure that the foster parent or temporary custodian has been provided with notice of the hearing by DHHS.
- Attend and participate in any staffings and discuss case goal and concurrent goal.
- Interview client, caseworker, and all witnesses.
- Review all evidence to be submitted during the hearing.
- Share with opposing counsel all evidence to be submitted by AAL during the hearing.

## **Court Findings:**

In its review orders the court shall determine and include in its orders the following:

- Whether the case plan, services and current placement meet the special needs and best interest of the juvenile, with the juvenile's health, safety and education specifically addressed; A.C.A. '9-27-360(b)(1)
- Whether DHHS has made reasonable efforts to finalize a permanency plan for the child; and A.C.A. '9-27-360(b)(2)
- Whether the case plan is moving toward an appropriate permanency plan pursuant to A.C.A. '9-27-338. A.C.A. '9-27-360(b)(3)
- Court shall consider extent of parties' compliance with case plan and court orders to finalize the permanency plan. A.C.A. '9-27-360(c)

# AAL POST TERMINATION OF PARENTAL RIGHTS HEARING CHECKLIST

#### **Best Practices:**

- ✓ Investigate agency's efforts to find adoptive placements. DCFS is required to run matching data within 5 days of the termination.
- ✓ Investigate the status of any subsidy applications.
- ✓ Assure that APPLA and ILP services are provided for age appropriate children.
- ✓ Assure that adoption specialist and ILP specialist, when assigned to the case, attend all hearings.
- ✓ Counsel the child as to the advantages of staying in foster care past age 18.
- ✓ Counsel clients on the process to opt back into to ILP services should they chose to leave foster care at age 18.
- ✓ Assure that their clients have signed permission to appear on the adoption web site.
- ✓ Assure that they receive and review the entire adoption packet prior to adoption. AAL should ensure that their age appropriate clients sign adoption consent forms.

Best Practice: An adoption should not be completed until any appeals are exhausted. The adoption can be completed as soon as the appeal mandate is issued.

#### **Post-Trial Activities:**

- Review court order for accuracy and completeness.
- AAL must monitor compliance with court orders.
- AAL must explain to age-appropriate clients the hearing outcome and its meaning.
